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THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

iLEAD North Hollywood (iLEAD NoHo), serving grades 9-12 has completed a second year as one of the new iLEAD Hybrid sites. As a two-year-old public/charter provider of secondary education offering a modified classroom-based/independent study format, it has garnered noteworthy college acceptances and nationwide placements alongside state- and national-level speech and debate awards (named one of the United States' Top-20 Programs for last two years), first place-in-Los Angeles Get Lit honors (including the current Los Angeles Youth Poet Laureate), Science Olympiad team, and a contemporary music songwriting/recording program. Project-based learning plays a key role within its college-prep curriculum and teaching practices. Individual Learning Plans are implemented for every learner.

iLEAD NoHo's Classes of '16 and '17 were accepted to a wide array of colleges and universities throughout the nation, Canada and Ireland. They've matriculated at 65 institutions within a wide range of types and selectivity in terms of size/location/specialty. A sampling includes Georgetown University, Brown University, Reed College, Juniata College, Wellesley College, Columbia University, University of Redlands, Dartmouth College, Drew University, Bryn Mawr College, School of Visual Arts, New York University, UCLA, Oberlin College, Loyola University New Orleans, DePaul University, Goucher College, and others.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE ADMISSION:

Math – 30 Credits/Three Years (through Algebra 2 minimally); 4 Years Recommended

World Languages – 20 Credits/Two Years (Spanish or French); 3-4 Years Recommended

Social Studies – 30 Credits/3 Years Required

English – 40 Credits/4 Years Required

Science – 20 Credits/Two Years (Biology and Chemistry or Physics Required); 3-4 Years Recommended

Arts Electives – 10Credits/One year or more (most students take many more, chosen from a wide selection of offerings)
